

New panorama of the green economy in Argentina: an inventory of policies and a labour diagnostic for a just transition

The Partnership for Action on Green Economy (PAGE) prepared two seminal reports for reflecting on public and private initiatives that refer to the transition towards green employment and towards a sustainable economy, whose main concepts and findings are summarized here.

Some of the most revealing data include the following:


- ▶ There were approximately 732,000 green jobs in the country in 2018.
 - ▶ This figure represents 3.3 per cent of total employment
- ▶ and 7.3 per cent of wage earners registered in the social security system



Inventory of policies related to the green economy in Argentina

It reveals and maps public initiatives on the green economy at the national level.

- The inventory offers recommendations for achieving the transition towards an economy that produces low carbon emissions, uses resources efficiently and is socially inclusive.
- It organizes the initiatives based on three central concepts of the green economy: bioeconomy, circular economy and energy transition, closely linked to the sustainable development goals of the 2030 Agenda and the climate goals of the Paris Agreement.



Labour diagnostic of the just transition towards a green economy in Argentina

It details the necessary steps for moving forward in the transition towards a greener economy in the country.

- The labour diagnostic describes a paradigm shift: the passage must be based on decent work for all and on inclusive societies that eradicate poverty.
- It maintains that the transition towards a greener economy can be considered a new type of production revolution.
